Councilman Todd Gordon led the flag salute.

CALL TO ORDER

FINAL REMARKS BY MAYOR AND COUNCIL

<u>Councilman Beinfest</u> – Councilman Beinfest reported that the Linwood Board of School Estimates meeting was held last night to approve the 2014-2015 school budget. The budget includes a two percent increase.

Councilman Matik – Councilman Matik indicated that the Police Department rarely gets recognition. He discussed a situation where the police got a call to assist an elderly resident. When they arrived at the home, the resident was nonresponsive. The Officers broke the door in and got the resident to the hospital. They also brought the resident home from the hospital and fixed the door. Councilman Matik commended Officers Coslop and Brown for their efforts. Councilman Matik also discussed a letter the Police Chief received from the Chief of Police in Somers Point expressing his gratitude for providing manpower to his department so that his officers could attend a funeral and commended the efforts of Captain Carman, Detective Sergeant Hamilton, and Detective Norris.

<u>Councilman Heun</u> – Councilman Heun thanked Mr. Kolakowski and his department for their efforts repairing the City streets. He also congratulated the Belhaven Think Team for winning the Middle School Think Team Competition.

<u>Council President Tighe</u> – Council President Tighe discussed an incident where he saw a suspicious looking man running down his street at 8:00 am with a back pack and alcohol. Council President Tighe texted Detective Norris who responded in two minutes along with Officers Brown and Moran. They apprehended the suspect and discovered the items in the back pack had been stolen from a nearby home. All the items were returned. Council President Tighe commended the efforts of Detective Norris and Officers Brown and Moran. He also thanked Mr. Kolakowski and his department for their efforts with the recent snow storm.
