2. Approval of Minutes Without Formal Reading

3. Councilman Beinfest

A. Neighborhood Services

1. Councilman Beinfest discussed a Resolution on the agenda awarding a Contract for Façade Restoration and Stabilization of the Leedsville Schoolhouse. Three contractors were prequalified by the NJ Historic Trust. The low bidder is Nickles Contracting, Inc. at \$55, 115.00. The project is being funded by a grant from the Trust.

A. Public Works

- 1. Councilwoman DeDomenicis advised a Resolution on the agenda authorizing a Shared Service Agreement with ACUA for the purchase of compressed natural gas.
- 2. The Public Works Appreciation Luncheon was held last Friday. Joe Olden was awarded Employee of the Year and Mike Ware was awarded a Special Honor.

5. Councilman Gordon

A. Engineering

1. Mr. Mazur reported that the Frances Avenue drainage project is moving along. The pipe work is complete from Grammercy to New Road. The next section of pipe work will be installed on the other side of New Road.

A. Revenue & Finance

- 1. Mr. Strazzeri explained that the Capital Bond Ordinance on the agenda for first reading is for the capital projects for the year.
- 2. A Resolution is on the agenda authorizing a Special Emergency Note for the Revaluation that will be completed.
- 3. A Resolution is on the agenda to amend the Capital Budget. This is to match the values with the Bond Ordinance.

- 4. Councilman Beinfest advised that Egg Harbor Township is exploring the possibility of installing a dog park. Councilman Beinfest requested approval from Council to engage in discussions with Egg Harbor Township for the possibility of a shared service for same.
