ORDINANCE NO. 10, 2021

A BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$71,250) IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY OF LINWOOD FOR VARIOUS GENERAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE CITY OF LINWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Appropriation for Projects-Down Payment.

The general improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the City of Linwood, in the County of Atlantic, New Jersey (the "City"). For the said improvements or purposes stated in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the sums of money therein stated as the apportionments made for said improvements or purposes, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000), including the aggregate sum of THREE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$3,750) as the down payment for said improvements as required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11 and more particularly described in Section 3 and now available by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the City for down payments for capital improvement purposes, and including also monies received or expected to be received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey or the County of Atlantic, or agencies thereof, as grants in aid of financing said improvements or purposes.

Section 2. Authorization of Bonds.

For the financing of said improvements or purposes and to meet the part of said SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000) in appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the City are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$71,250) pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey (the "Local Bond Law"). In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the City in a principal amount not exceeding SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$71,250) are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. <u>Description of Projects</u>.

The excess of the appropriations made for the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the said down payments for said purposes.

Section 4. <u>Authorization of Notes</u>.

In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements, negotiable notes of the City in a principal amount equal to the said principal of bonds not exceeding SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$71,250) are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. All such note(s) shall mature at such time as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer or such other financial officer designated by Resolution for this purpose (both being hereinafter referred to in this Section as Chief Financial Officer); provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its issue date. Such note(s) shall bear interest at a rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with any note(s) issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon such note(s) shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell the note(s) from time to time at public or private sale in such amounts as the Chief Financial Officer may determine and not less than par, and to deliver the same from time to time to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof as payment thereof. Such Chief Financial Officer is authorized and directed to report in writing to the Mayor and the Council of the City at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the note(s) pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate, the maturity schedule of the note(s) sold, price obtained and the name of the purchaser. All note(s) issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time for periods not exceeding one (1) year for the time period specified in and in accordance with the provisions and limitations of N.I.S.A. 40A:2-8(a) of the Local Bond Law.

The Chief Financial Officer is further directed to determine all matters in connection with said note or notes and not determined by this Ordinance. The signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon said note(s) shall be conclusive evidence of such determination.

Section 5. <u>Capital Budget</u>.

The capital budget of the City of Linwood is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the capital budget and capital program is on the file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. Additional Matters.

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are properties or improvements which the City may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of said obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is **15.00 years**.

- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the City Clerk and a complete duplicate thereof has been electronically filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$71,250), and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) Amounts not exceeding THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000) in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, a reasonable proportion of the compensation and expenses of employees of the City in connection with the construction or acquisition of improvements and properties as authorized herein, and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of the Local Bond Law have been included as part of the cost of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 7. <u>Ratification of Prior Actions</u>.

Any actions taken by any officials of the City in connection with the improvements described in Section 3 hereof are hereby ratified and confirmed notwithstanding that such actions may have been taken prior to the effective date of this bond ordinance and shall be deemed to have been taken pursuant to this bond ordinance.

Section 8. <u>Application of Grants</u>.

Any grant moneys received for the purposes described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the

obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. Full Faith and Credit.

The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the City for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 10. Official Intent to Reimburse Expenditures.

The City reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures towards the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. No funds from sources other than the bonds or notes authorized herein has been or is reasonably expected to be reserved, allocated on a long-term basis or otherwise set aside by the City, or any member of the same "control group" as the City, within the meaning of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-1(f), pursuant to their budget or financial policies with respect to any expenditures to be reimbursed. This Section is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the City's official intent to reimburse any expenditures towards the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof to be incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein in accordance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.103-18, and no action (or inaction) will be an artifice or device in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section yield restrictions or arbitrage rebate requirements.

Section 11. <u>Effective Date</u>.

This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication of a summary thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF LINWOOD AND THE TOWNSHIP OF HAMILTON **SHARED** FOR MUNICIPAL COURT SERVICES THROUGH THE **TOWNSHIP** REGIONAL COURT HAMILTON PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1B AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES HERETOFORE ADOPTED, THE PROVISIONS OF WHICH ARE INCONSISTENT HEREWITH.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Hamilton Township Ordinance No. 1834-2016, the Hamilton Township Regional Municipal Court was established; and

WHEREAS, Linwood currently has a shared municipal court with Northfield; and

WHEREAS, Hamilton and Linwood believe it to be in the public interest of their respective residents to have Linwood join the Hamilton Township Regional Municipal Court for the benefit and service of both municipalities; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1(b) provides in part that:

Two or more municipalities, by ordinance, may enter into an agreement establishing a single joint municipal court and providing for its administration. A copy of the agreement shall be filed with the Administrative Director of the Courts; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq. empowers municipalities to enter into Shared Services Agreements; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 2B-12-1(b) and <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:65-1, et. seq. Linwood has indicated a willingness to enter into a Shared Services Agreement with Hamilton to permit Hamilton to provide all of the usual and ordinary services of the Municipal Court for Linwood; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 2B-12-1(b) and <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:65-1, et. seq. Hamilton has indicated a willingness to enter into a Shared Services Agreement with Linwood to provide all of the usual and ordinary services of the Municipal Court for Linwood; and

WHEREAS, Hamilton is amending and adopting new provisions of Chapter 52 of the Municipal Code of the Township of Hamilton as follows:

§52-5 Jurisdiction.

The jurisdiction of the Township of Hamilton Regional Municipal Court shall be coextensive with the territory of the Township of Hamilton and City of Northfield and the City of Linwood.

§52-12 Shared Service Agreements.

A. Hamilton hereby approves and agrees to the Shared Services Agreement and any subsequent amendments thereto, by and between the Township of Hamilton and the City of Northfield and between the Township of Hamilton and the City of Linwood to join the Hamilton Township Regional Court and expressly authorizes the Mayor and the Clerk of the Township of Hamilton to execute the agreements on behalf of Hamilton.

§52-15. Withdrawal by municipality.

Any municipality may withdraw from participation in the Hamilton Township Regional Court by delivering a written notice to the other municipality of its intention to withdraw no less than one full year prior to the date of withdrawal. All withdrawals shall be effective January 1, no earlier than one full year subsequent to the date of notice of withdrawal. In the event an Atlantic County Court for the disposition of all municipal court matters come into existence, the period of notification shall be ninety (90) days to withdrawal from the shared services agreement. The ninety (90) day time period shall only be applicable to those municipalities joining a central Atlantic County Court for the adjudication of all municipal court matters.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Linwood, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, subject to approval of the State of New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts and the Assignment Judge of Vicinage I-Atlantic and Cape May Counties as follows:

SECTION 1. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.

SECTION 2. Linwood hereby approves and agrees to the Shared Services Agreement and any subsequent amendments thereto, by and between the Township of Hamilton and the City of Linwood to join the Hamilton Township Regional Court and expressly authorizes the Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Linwood to execute the agreements on behalf of the City of Linwood.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the attached Shared Services Agreement on behalf of the City of Linwood subject to the approval of the State of New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts and the Assignment Judge of Vicinage I-Atlantic and Cape May Counties:

<u>SECTION 4</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies and should any section, clause, sentence or provision of any item in this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect after final adoption, publication, and approval of the State of New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts and the Assignment Judge of Vicinage I-Atlantic and Cape May Counties.

ORDINANCE NO. 14, 2021

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 183 NUISANCES, **ARTICLE** PROHIBITIONS, I SECTION 183-1, PROHIBITED USES. **AND** 183-5 ARTICLE IV. PENALTIES, **SECTION** VIOLATIONS AND PENATLIES OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF LINWOOD AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES HERETOFORE ADOPTED, THE PROVISIONS OF WHICH ARE INCONSISTENT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Linwood, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 183, Article I, Section 183-1 Prohibited uses, Section B(2)(b)[10], is hereby amended to read as follows:

[10] A commercial establishment, which is licensed and authorized to sell alcoholic beverages, from which loud noise emanates as a result of musical instruments, bands, mechanical musical devices and/or any sound reproduction device, including but not limited to megaphones, air horns and whistles, live entertainment or patrons, from either the inside or any outside portion of such establishment, shall be in violation of this section whenever such noise is significantly audible, to be determined at the sole discretion of the enforcing authority, at the property line of the source from where it emanates. All music must end by 10:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and by 11:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

SECTION 2: Chapter 183, Article IV, Section 183-5 Violations and penalties, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of at least \$250 but not to exceed \$500 for the first offense (no penalty will be imposed for a first offense for a commercial entity if the business certifies that it has corrected the condition and provides satisfactory and verifiable evidence of the correction), a fine of at least \$750 but not to exceed \$1,500 for the second offense, and a fine of at least \$1,500 but not to exceed \$2,500 for the third offense.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 4: Should any sentence, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage, publication and adoption in the manner prescribed by law.

- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A4-45.3 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the CAP law)
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
 - 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated,
 - b. Items if appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of $N.J.S.A.\ 40A:\ 4-5$ shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.


